For the second edition of this volume a number of changes have been made. Elizabeth Gaskell's *Our Society at Cranford* has been added, as has Anthony Trollope's A *Turkish Bath*. Charles Dickens is now represented with a number of short selections. The selection of poems by D.G. Rossetti has been expanded considerably, as has that by Michael Field. A selection of poems by two key figures, Hardy and Yeats, is also now included.

Several of the Contexts sections in the volume have been expanded - notably "The Place of Women in Society", which now includes material concerning the Contagious Diseases Acts and "Britain, Empire, and a Wider World", which now includes a section on the Great Exhibition of 1851.

The anthology reflects (and will contribute to) the ongoing reassessment of the canon that is central to English Studies today; in all, sixty-six poets are represented.
